



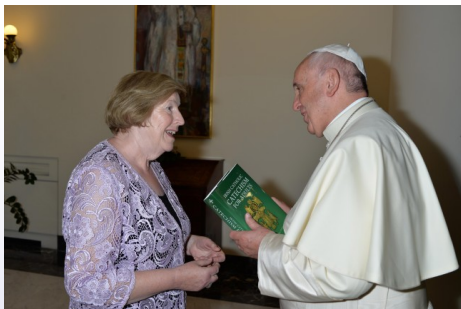

## Irish Catholic Catechism for Adults presented to Pope Francis

The *Irish Catholic Catechism for Adults* is a new publication from the Irish Episcopal Conference. The result of several years' work, this catechism is a call to renewal of faith among adults, at a time when people may be questioning if the good news of Jesus Christ applies to them. It responds to the recommendation in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* that Episcopal Conferences would develop 'local catechisms, which take into account various situations and cultures, while carefully preserving the unity of faith and fidelity to catholic doctrine'. The new catechism was launched in June and a copy was presented to Pope Francis by Ms Maura Hyland, Director of Veritas, on 26 June.

## Bishop Doran on vocations

Speaking at his episcopal ordination on 13 July, Bishop Kevin Doran said: "Priesthood is what might be described as a minority vocation, at the service of the majority. But, for some reason, when the question of vocation to priesthood arises, there seems to be an assumption that the priest will come from someone else's family or from some other community. I want to offer you a challenge. Will you find one suitable candidate for priesthood in each deanery between now and Easter and invite him to contact me or one of the members of the vocations team?" Bishop John McAreevey, Bishop of Dromore and Chair of the Bishops' Council for Justice and Peace has called for prayers for peace in the Middle East saying: "The death and destruction that we are witnessing in certain parts of the Middle East is truly shocking and heart-breaking. I encourage all Christians and all people of goodwill to pray for an end to the conflicts in Iraq, in Syria, in Palestine, and in Israel."

"I therefore invite everybody to join in solidarity with all who are suffering in the Middle East and to pray, both personally and at Masses, for peace and justice in these lands."
