SPEAKERS

Emily O'Reilly is our keynote speaker On 11 June 2009, Emily O'Reilly was appointed to a second six year term as Ombudsman and Information Commissioner by then President, Mrs Mary McAleese. As Ombudsman, Ms O'Reilly is also an exofficio member of the Standards in Public Office

Commission, the Referendum Commission, the Constituency Commission and the Commission for Public Service Appointments. In May 2007, following the introduction of the Access to Information on the Environment Regulations, Ms O'Reilly was assigned the additional role of Commissioner for Environmental Information. Prior to her appointment as Ombudsman and Information Commissioner in June 2003, Ms O'Reilly was an accomplished journalist and author whose roles included many years as a political correspondent with prominent print and broadcasting media. She is a native of Tullamore, Co Offaly and is married with five children. Ms O'Reilly is a graduate of UCD and TCD. She was also the recipient of a Niemann Fellowship in Journalism at Harvard University, Cambridge, U.S.A. In December 2008 Ms O'Reilly was awarded a Doctor of Laws by the National University of Ireland in recognition of her contribution to public service and to human rights.

Gerard O'Neill is Chairman of Amárach Research. He leads the strategic consulting practice in Amárach, working with senior management teams to create resilient strategies



for the future. He is a co-founder of Hireland.ie, the job creation initiative. Gerard is a director of the Irish Internet Association and was previously chairman of the Marketing Society. He is on the external advisory board of the UCD Institute of Food & Health as well as the board of Beacon of Light Counselling Support Service. His book - 2016: A New proclamation for a New Generation - was published recently.



Michael "Mickey" Harte is the current manager of Tyrone Gaelic football team. He has led the team to three All-Ireland titles, three Ulster titles, one National League, and four Dr McKenna Cups to date. Raised in Ballymacilroy outside Ballygawley, County

Tyrone, Mickey is a columnist, author and a renowned public speaker. In October 2009 he published an autobiography, *Harte: Presence is the Only Thing*.

She has worked as a staff chaplain at Bon Secours Hospital in Cork and Director of Clinical Pastoral Education at St. Vincent's University Hospital, Dublin.
