Jan Michael Joncas

Michael Joncas is a priest of the Archdiocese of St. Paul-Minneapolis, MN, and serves as Artist in Residence and Research Fellow in Catholic Studies at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, MN. He studied liturgy at the University of Notre Dame, Notre Dame, IN and the

Pontificio Istituto Liturgico of S. Anselmo in Rome. He is the author of five books and over two hundred articles and reviews. He has composed and arranged over 300 pieces of liturgical music.



Bishop Harold Miller

Harold Miller is bishop of Down and Dromore. A native of Belfast, he studied at Trinity College Dublin and then went to St John's College Nottingham for ordination training. Harold was ordained deacon in 1976 and presbyter a year. In 1979 he returned to his old theological college as Director of Extension Studies and Chaplain, where he developed Theological Education by Extension. In 1984, Harold returned to Ireland, as chaplain at Queen's University, Belfast and in 1989, he became rector of Carrigrohane parish in Co Cork until he was appointed bishop in 1997. He is chair of the Liturgical Advisory Committee, including during the time when it produced the new Book of Common Prayer and

a member of the Hymnal Revision Committee which produced the 2000 Hymnal.



Sister Anne Codd PBVM

Dr Anne Codd is an Irish Presentation Sister and has been involved for many years in educational, community and pastoral development in Ireland and further afield, with a particular interest in Church as both community of faith and social organisation.

She is currently Resource Person for the Council for Pastoral Renewal and Adult Faith Development of the Irish Episcopal Conference.



Fr Peter McVerry, SJ

Peter McVerry SJ has been working with Dublin's young homeless for more than 30 years. During this time he has campaigned tirelessly for the rights of these young people. In 1979, he opened a hostel to address the urgent need for accommodation for young homeless people. Four years later he set up a charity now called Peter McVerry Trust which today offers an open

access service, supported accommodation, drug services, under 18s hostels and apartments across the city to offer longer-term housing for those ready to live independently.



Dr Frank Lawrence

Frank Lawrence is Lecturer in Early Music History at the School of Music, His doc toral dissertation at UCD under the joint supervision of Prof. Dr David Hiley (Regensburg) and Prof. Harry White, is a study of the oldest extant notated musical source from Ireland – a mid-twelfth century chant manuscript. His principal research is on Western medieval liturgical chant with particular emphasis on palaeographical, repertorial and codicological studies of manuscript sources from the British Isles and northern Europe. His research also encompasses medieval notation in periods of transition, liturgical history in the medieval West, musical culture in Early Modern Italy and performance practice (medieval chant and polyphony).
