Pope Francis' Message for Lent 2015 : Make Your Hearts Firm

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday 18 February. Pope Francis' message for Lent has been published on the theme 'Make Your Hearts Firm'. In his message Pope Francis addresses the issue of the globalisation of indifference in our world saying: "Indifference to our neighbour and to God represents a real temptation for us Christians. God is not indifferent to our world; he so loves it that he gave his Son for our salvation."



Pope Francis goes on to say: "Lent is a time of renewal for the whole Church, for each community and every believer. Above all it is a "time of grace" (2 Cor6:2). Today, this selfish attitude of indifference has taken on global proportions, to the extent that we can speak of a globalisation of indifference. It is a problem which we, as Christians, need to confront."
