How to Pray the Rosary



"Through the Rosary the faithful receive abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer." - Saint John Paul II *Rosarium Virginis Mariae*

"I encourage all parishes and faith communities to pray for the intention of the Family. In praying the Rosary we meditate on the life and ministry of Jesus Christ and the life of the Holy Family." - **Archbishop Eamon Martin, Archbishop of Armagh.**

The Rosary from the Latin word *rosarium*, meaning 'Crown of Roses' is a form of prayer. The prayers that essentially compose the Rosary are arranged in sets of ten *Hail Marys* preceded by one *Lord's Prayer* and followed by one *Glory Be to the Father*.

During recitation of each set, known as a decade, thought is given to one of the Mysteries of the Rosary, which recall events in the lives of Jesus and Mary. Normally, five decades are recited in a session. Other prayers are sometimes added after each decade (in particular, the Fatima Prayer) and before (in particular, the Apostles' Creed), and after (in particular, the Hail, Holy Queen) the five decades taken as a whole.

The traditional Rosary is divided into three parts, each having five mysteries: Glorious, Joyful and Sorrowful.

OUR FATHER, Who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy Kingdom come. Thy Will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
AMEN.

HAIL MARY, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of death.
AMEN.

GLORY BE to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end.
AMEN.

In his apostolic letter *The Rosary of the Virgin Mary*, Saint John Paul II proposed a new set of mysteries which he called the Luminous, and which concern the period of the public life of Our Lord. For those who wish to say all 20 decades at once during the course, they may be said in the following order: Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful and Glorious.

For those who wish to say five decades per day, Saint John Paul II proposed the following schedule:

Joyful: Monday & Saturday

Sorrowful: Tuesday & Friday

Glorious: Wednesday & Sunday

Luminous: Thursday
