



Opening of Holy Doors for the Jubilee of Mercy 2015 - 2016



Pope Francis has said that every diocese in the world may designate a holy door to be opened for a year, so that even those who can't go to Rome can participate in the Church's Jubilee Year of Mercy by walking through the doors. Holy doors symbolically represent Jesus, who said, "I am the door." (John 10:7) Irish dioceses have now opened Holy Doors of Mercy locally so the faithful may participate in the ritual of the holy door for the Jubilee Year of Mercy. President Higgins addresses 30th anniversary conference of ICPO

On 3 December President Michael D Higgins addressed the 30th anniversary conference of the Irish Council for Prisoners Overseas in Dublin. He said: "The attention you bring to the serious issues facing Irish citizens in prisons both in the UK and in countries around the world is vital work that is appreciated by the Irish men and women



themselves who are prisoners, by their families left behind and by all of us here in Ireland who value the good and important work you are doing." A new research report *A Step At A Time* was published analysing the re-settlement needs of Irish people returning from prison overseas. Bishops' Council for Education on autonomy of schools

The Bishops' Council for Education issued a statement supporting the autonomy of schools saying: "Faith schools exist because many parents wish to have their children educated in accordance with their religious convictions. If the ethos of faith schools is undermined then the rights of such parents are compromised."
