

### Pope Francis approves beatification of Venerable John Sullivan SJ

Archbishop Eamon Martin of Armagh and Archbishop Diarmuid Martin of Dublin have welcomed the news that Pope Francis has approved the beatification of Venerable John Sullivan SJ (1861-1933). Archbishop Diarmuid Martin said John Sullivan was marked in a special way by a great care for the sick. He said "Reading his biographies is like reading a directory of the hospitals and the homes for the sick in the Dublin of his

days." Archbishop Eamon Martin said that the news will be welcomed by all those, in Ireland and around the world, who have a devotion to him and who have been inspired by his ministry. He said "It is because of his reputation as a holy and healing person that so many people still visit his tomb in Gardiner Street Church in Dublin each year to pray for his intercession."
