Crisis Pregnancy (Crisis Pregnancy Agency, Department of Health and Children, 2007) and Strengthening Families through Fathers (Family Support Agency, Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs, 2004) both with Professor Harry Ferguson; and Listening to Children: Children's Stories of Domestic Violence (Office of the Minister for Children, Department of Health and Children, 2007), with Máire O'Reilly. He serves on the Editorial Board of the International Sage Journal, Men and Masculinities and he has been appointed to the International Associate Board of Men and Masculinities Research Centre at Bradford University, UK.
